

Meal Deliveries COVID-19 Vaccines



Reopened in June of 2021, with many regular activities resumed, including over 1,000 hours of Bingo and a new tradition called "B.L.T. Bingo", which included the preparation of B.L.T. sandwiches with tomatoes from the Senior Center garden

Congregate meals resumed in October of 2021

3,160 key fob swipes at the Senior Center (fob is swiped each time a member visits the Senior Center to attend a program or event)






# Ohio Auditor of State Award with Distinction


















#### **Auditor of State Award with Distinction**



#### **Upcoming Expiring Levy:**

- It is an Emergency Levy, worth \$2.69 million of revenue per year
- It was last renewed in November 2018 for 5 years, and will expire at the end of 2023
- Renewing this levy at some point during 2022 or 2023 will be critical to the financial stability of the district's operations.
- Renewing this levy will NOT increase taxes.



**Repaving of Brookpark Road -** \$480,000 in funding through NOACA's Transportation Improvement Program funding

Cleveland Metroparks connector trail along Mastick Road hill and installation of a controlled crossing on Mastick Road - \$150,000 in funding through Cuyahoga County's Municipal Grant for controlled crossing





- Installation of an electric vehicle charging station at City Hall Implemented by NOACA at no cost to the City
- **Design and engineering for a noise wall along a portion of I-480 –** Implemented by ODOT at no cost to the City
