

#### >> TREASURER'S NOTES

As Treasurer of the Fairview Park City School District, I am honored to provide an overview of our financial performance for the 2022-2023 school year. Committing to foscal responsibility and accurate financial reporting remains an important part of our daily operations. Our awards and recognitions for accurate financial reporting are a direct result of our staff's exceptional and dillicent work.

During the 2022-2023 academic year, our District saw a total revenue of \$2.6.7 million, mostly from local property taxes, state allocations, and federal grants. In November 2022, the community of Fairview Park passed Issue 7, a renewal levy that funded 10.7% of the overall operational budget. Combined with our excellent facilities, the renewal of Issue 7 provides a solid foundation for

educating children and preparing them for a bright future.

Expenditures for the same period amounted to approximately \$24.5 million. Most of these funds went

directly into the classrooms, supporting salaries, benefits, extracurricular activities, purchased services, materials, supplies, and professional development. By focusing on strategic investments, we aim to enhance the educational experience for our students, equipping them with the skills necessary for success in a dynamic world.

Accurate reporting of our financial activities is not just a legal obligation but a commitment to transparency and accountability. We understand that our community entrusts us with their hard-earned tax dollars, and we must ensure that every penny is allocated efficiently and reported accurately.

In closing, I want to express my gratitude for the support and trust the Fairview Park City School District community has placed in us. Together, we will continue to prioritize diligent spending, transparent reporting, and educational excellence to benefit our students and our community's prosperity.



#### **>> 2023-2024 PROJECTED GENERAL FUND REVENUES**



#### Treasurer's Comments:

As you can see in the charts above, our total revenues and expenditures are near the halfway point of the year's expected amounts as we close the books for December. Our school district operates on a fiscal year from July 1 through June 30, so it is no surprise that we have realized approximately half of our expected revenues and expenses as we are six months into this fiscal year.

The district's finances are influenced by many of the same outside forces we face with our personal finances. For example, the district's Purchased Services expense line has grown compared to last year due to inflation. Additionally, you may have noticed that your banking interest rates are higher than last year, which is no different for the district. This is why the district's All Other Revenues line is outpacing last year's amount.


